This year's speaker will be Ken Anderson, author of **Dan Moody, Crusader for Justice**. He will tell the story of an epic chapter in Williamson County history---the trial of the Ku Klux Klan in the 26th District Court—the indictment of members of a group of "virtue vigilantes" which flogged, tarred and feathered a traveling salesman for dating a widow. Two jury trials followed in the early 1920s resulting in a national and international news story set at the height of the Klan's political power in the United States. Moody went on to become the youngest Attorney General and Governor of the State of Texas, held in the highest esteem for his true moral compass and devotion to justice.

DISPLAYS:

Gary Spivey and his daughter Kandice Spivey Wright will display delightful photographs from days gone by of "old" Liberty Hill. Kandice will check with Gary to see if they have anything special to surprise us with, as they have in past years.

BOOKS: The Culture of the Shin Oak Ridge Folk by J. Gordon Bryson and Recollections and Observations of Judge C. L. Chance by Joseph E.
